



RYDE ON TIME

Galliford Try Rail has completed the redevelopment of Newport Station in South Wales in time for the Ryder Cup golf tournament this weekend.

The main structures are spiral terminal buildings on either side of the track connected by a footbridge and lifts. They are believed to be the first buildings to combine specialist section steel in ornate shapes with ethylene tetrafluoroethylene and curtain glazing.

The project has included one and two-storey accommodation blocks, a 50 m extension to platform 4 and a new car park.

At 2,100 sq m, the new station is twice the size of the old one and will handle 2,000 additional passengers a day during the Ryder Cup.
